
POLLINATOR GARDEN

This partnership allows current and former tobacco farmers to diversify and expand production, buffer and extend their growing season and significantly improve the sustainability of their farms, both economically and environmentally. The produce supports Second Harvest's distribution of fresh produce throughout Winston-Salem and the surrounding area to food pantries, other nonprofits and needy families.

Our donation to Atrium Health Wake Forest Baptist allowed the Maya Angelou Center for Health Equity to establish the STEM Education Fund which focuses on improving minority representation in healthcarerelated careers. Ultimately, the donation will provide benefits for patients, the healthcare system and the community. Goler Depot Street aims to build an empowered and sustained community in urban areas of Winston-Salem through affordable real estate development, workforce training, economic growth and job creation. The organization's **TechCareers** program provides unemployed and underemployed individuals with technical education and career-readiness training to prepare them for careers in the Information Technology field.

The Reynolds American Foundation Scholarship, managed through the National Merit Scholarship Program, was founded in 2000 as a way to help ease the financial burden of higher education for employees and their children. Since 2000, the National Merit Scholarship Program has awarded 330 scholarships valued at combined total of \$2.710.000.



Vocational Technical Scholarships

The Vocational Technical Scholarship provides funding for several in-demand programs for the children of employees, including advanced manufacturing and engineering technologies, construction and architectural design and computer programming. In 2024, Vocational Technical Scholarships were granted to four recipients.



Learning Everyday

Accomplishing Dreams (LEAD) Girls of North Carolina, Inc. envisions a world where every girl has the confidence, social skills and leadership ability she needs to change the trajectory of her life. Our donations fund support for up to 60 young girls during the school year.

The Santa Fe Natural Tobacco Company (SFNTC) Foundation is delivering on a mission for the preservation, promotion and advancement of American Indian self-sufficiency in the U.S., with a focus on:

- The development of American Indian entrepreneurism;
- Facilitating American Indian education; and
- The preservation and enhancement of American Indian culture.





INDIGENOUSWAYS

The annual IndigenousWays Festival celebrates the Diné and Maori/Samoan communities in Santa Fe, NM, including diverse artists and performers. SFNTC Foundation's donation to the festival funded key programming and American Sign Language interpreters, helping to provide broader accessibility.



SKANIKULAT, INC.

Skanikulat, Inc. provides cultural wellness, language immersion and outreach to the Oneida community in Greater Green Bay, WI. In 2024, with support from the SFNTC Foundation, Skanikulat, Inc. enhanced their **Oneida language** program with digital tools like tablets and software. This aided language learning and supports the creation of multimedia resources, furthering Skanikulat, Inc.'s mission to revitalize the Oneida language and culture.

FUNDAMENTAL NEEDS

Fundamental Needs, with SFNTC Foundation support, launched the Oasis Project to provide clean water and electricity on the New Mexico Navajo Reservation. High school students received vocational training while installing off-grid water systems. In 2024, nine systems were installed, and 15 students were trained, improving infrastructure and empowering youth.

ONE SPIRIT

One Spirit partners with the Oglala Lakota tribe from South Dakota on Pine Ridge Reservation to address nutrition shortages, high unemployment and lack of community support. SFNTC Foundation's funding for Horse Spirit Camp allowed 20 at-risk Lakota youth to learn traditional horse activities, while also gaining lessons in self-respect, responsibility and confidence.

GLOBAL PEACE TRAIN

Global Peace Train, funded by the SFNTC Foundation, created **"Ghost** Dance," an interactive program for festivals, schools and museums. Led by Lakota Medicine Man Dave Swallow Jr., the project aims to preserve Indigenous wisdom and raise awareness about the Lakota people and their endangered traditions through a digital library.



WISHTOYO FOUNDATION

With funding from SFNTC Foundation, Wishtoyo's **Restoring** Native Food Systems program restores traditional knowledge and food security through a Native-led eco-farm. It includes a seed bank, increased food sovereignty and shared Indigenous knowledge,

promoting sustainable farming and equal access to resources.



FREEDOM LODGE

Freedom Lodge in South Dakota leveraged SFNTC Foundation funds for a Historical Trauma Master **Class™**, addressing complex trauma with culturally relevant, somatic methods. The 2024 program involved 14 advanceddegree students from various Tribal Nations, blending in-person and online learning with inter-tribal healthcare collaboration.





SCOPE OF GIVING

American Snuff Company (ASC) Charitable Trust provides financial support to nonprofit organizations in Winston-Salem, NC and Clarksville, TN, with a demonstrated ability to aid the local community. The ASC Trust focuses on:

- Employee directed donations in ASC areas of operation; and
- Charitable, Scientific, Literary, or Educational Purposes.
